RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ADDITION OF BUS STOP ALONG CLIFTON AVENUE, WEST BOUND, ON THE NORTHERLY SIDE THEREOF AT FLEISCHER PLACE

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Municipal Council of the City of Clifton, County of Passaic, State of New Jersey, that:

1. Pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 39:4-8(e)*, the following described location in the City of Clifton is designated as a bus stop:

COUNTY ROAD

Along Clifton Avenue, westbound, on the northerly side thereof at the following location:

Fleischer Place - near side (31377). Beginning at the easterly curb line of Fleischer Place and extending 105 feet easterly therefrom.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Municipal Council of the City of Clifton will enforce the needed traffic regulations governing the aforementioned bus stop location and provide the necessary police security to ensure the safety of the traveling public; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect upon approval of the Commissioner of Transportation as provided by law.

Dear Ms. Tolosi,

At the request of a passenger, NJ Transit is requesting to establish a bus stop along the route to mirror the sister location on Clifton Avenue, eastbound at Randolph Avenue, midblock (30263) in the opposite direction to accommodate customers with a discharge location for the 744-line.

I investigated the proposed location and found that it is warranted in accordance with standard traffic safety guidelines set by NJDOT and found them acceptable in the preparation of bus stop resolutions.

Under State statute, the power to designate bus stops rests with the municipalities, not NJ TRANSIT. NJ TRANSIT does post signs at all sanctioned bus stops and works closely with the municipalities to provide safe and convenient stops.

Enclosed for your consideration is a draft bus stop resolution. When approved, please forward a copy to me and Passaic County Board of Commissioners for concurrence. You may send your correspondence to:
