

RFP 24-013

**Youth Services Commission 2024-2026 Comprehensive Plan Grant Administered by The County
Department Of Human Services**

A review committee was convened for the purpose of evaluating requests for proposals submitted to the Purchasing Department in response to RFP 24-013 for the Passaic Department of Human Services. The committee consisted of Daniell Petillo, LaQuan Hargrove, and Jenny Vuksic.

The review committee convened on February 13th and February 15th. Eleven project clusters were listed in RFP 24-013. Proposals were evaluated utilizing the following criteria:

Management- 30 points, Technical -50 points and Cost -20 points

Below are the Vendors that submitted proposals and a composite point total of the evaluation.

Project Cluster #1 Programs in Prevention :

- A. Proposal submitted by: Mental Health Center of Passaic. 1451 Van Houten Clifton, NJ 07013

Committee feedback and analysis: The applicant is well qualified and has provided a similar service for the department. Submission of paperwork and reporting has been less than ideal with this vendor. The proposal could have contained adequate detail about staffing but failed to adequately address ADA compliance. There was appropriate detail in the service and budget descriptions.

Total Composite Score: 92.3

- B. Proposal submitted by: New Destiny family Success Center, INC., 79 Ellison street, Paterson, N.J 07505

Committee feedback and analysis: The applicant is well qualified and has a strong background, and partnership with various community agencies. The applicant included good detail about their past performance. The proposal could have contained more detail about emergency procedures and did not adequately address ADA compliance. There was good detail in the service and budget descriptions, although fringe benefits and consultant fees appeared to be excessive in comparison to services provided.

Total Composite Score: 90.3

- C. Proposal submitted by: Bella Chanel Mentoring Program, 40 Market St. Passaic, NJ 07055

Committee feedback and analysis: This applicant has a successful history of providing prevention services. The application could have included more detail about the background of the applicant. The application did not provide enough detail about the agency's compliance with ADA or their emergency plans. Outcomes didn't appear to be measurable.

Total Composite Score: 82.8

- D. Proposal submitted by: D.S Education Alliance LLC. Cultural Literacy Program, 16 Henry Street, Glen Rock, N.J 07452

Committee feedback and analysis: The applicant is well qualified and has provided a similar service for the department. Submission of paperwork and reporting have been ideal with this vendor. The proposal could have contained more details about staffing and failed to adequately address ADA compliance. There was appropriate detail in the service and budget descriptions.

Total Composite Score: 83.6

- E. Proposal submitted by: D.S Education Alliance LLC. Young Men's Leadership, 16 Henry Street, Glen Rock, N.J 07452

Committee feedback and analysis: The applicant is well qualified and has provided a similar service for the department. Submission of paperwork and reporting have been ideal with this vendor. The proposal could have contained more details about staffing and failed to adequately address ADA compliance. There was appropriate detail in the service and budget descriptions.

Total Composite Score: 90.3

- F. Proposal Submitted by: Big Brother Big Sisters of Coastal & Northern New Jersey, 305 Broad Street, 2nd Floor Asbury Park, N.J 07712

Committee feedback and analysis: The applicant is well qualified and has provided a similar service for the department. The Number of youths served can be higher as one reviewer commented. Failed to address ADA compliance. Staff had access to various training courses.

Total Composite Score: 89.4

- G. Proposal submitted by: D.S Education Alliance LLC. Music and African Dance, 16 Henry Street, Glen Rock, N.J 07452

Committee feedback and analysis: The applicant is well qualified and has provided a similar service for the department. Submission of paperwork and reporting have been ideal with this

vendor. The proposal could have contained more details about staffing and failed to adequately address ADA compliance. There was appropriate detail in the service and budget descriptions.

Total Composite Score: 86

- H. Proposal Submitted by: From Street to Christ Inc. 223 Jefferson St. Paterson, N.J 07522

Committee feedback and analysis: Reviewers, questioned if applicant is well qualified or have provided a similar service previously. The Number of youths served can be higher as one reviewer commented. Failed to address ADA compliance. Staff had access to various training courses.

Total Composite Score: 82.3

- I. Proposal Submitted by: United Way of Passaic County, 301 Main Street Paterson, N.J 07505

Committee feedback and analysis: The applicant submitted a complete proposal which highlighted their ability to provide service. The applicant is seeking to enhance an already established program within the school. Proposal failed to speak to emergency procedures, outcomes didn't appear to be measurable. No ADA compliance or emergency procedures mentioned in the proposal.

Total Composite Score: 89.4

Project Cluster #2 Programs in Detention Alternative:

- A. Proposal submitted by: M&S Integrated Psychotherapy & Counseling, 1157 Main Ave.

Committee feedback and analysis: The applicant is well qualified and has provided a similar service for the department. Submission of paperwork and reporting has been less than ideal with this vendor. The proposal contained adequate details about staffing, adequately addressed ADA compliance. There was appropriate detail in the service and budget descriptions.

Total Composite Score: 5

- B. Proposal submitted by: Proposal submitted by: M&S Integrated Psychotherapy & Counseling, 1157 Main Ave.

Committee feedback and analysis: The applicant is well qualified and has provided a similar service for the department. Submission of paperwork and reporting has been less than ideal

with this vendor. The proposal contained adequate details about staffing, adequately addressed ADA compliance. There was appropriate detail in the service and budget descriptions.

Total Composite Score: 92

Project Cluster #3 Programs in Disposition:

- A. Proposal submitted by: New Hope Integrated Behavioral Healthcare 80 Conover Road.
Marlboro, N.J 07746

Committee feedback and analysis: The applicant is well qualified and has a strong background, and partnership with various community agencies. The applicant included good details about their past performance. The proposal could have contained more details about emergency procedures and did not adequately address ADA compliance. There was good detail in the service and budget descriptions, although fringe benefits and consultant fees appeared to be excessive in comparison to the services provided.

Total Composite Score: 86.2

Project Cluster #4 Programs in Re-Entry:

- A. Proposal submitted by: Eva's Village Inc. Main Street Paterson, N.J 07522

Committee feedback and analysis: The applicant is well qualified and has a strong background, and partnership with various community agencies. The applicant included good details about their past performance. The proposal could have contained more details about emergency procedures and did not adequately address ADA compliance. There was good detail in the service and budget descriptions, although fringe benefits and consultant fees appeared to be excessive in comparison to the services provided.

Total Composite Score: 89.6

Project cluster # 1 Prevention committee recommendations:

- \$35,000 to be awarded to Mental Health Clinic of Passaic for the After School Prevention program.
- \$35,000 to be awarded to New Destiny Family Success Center inc. for Youth Resiliency.
- \$17,500 to be awarded to DS Education Alliance for Cultural Literacy Summer Workshop
- \$13,788 to be awarded to DS Education Alliance for the Young Men's Leadership
- \$13,788 to be awarded to DS Education Alliance for the Music and African Dance
- \$10,000 to be awarded to Big Brother Big Sisters for the one-on-one youth mentoring.

Project cluster # 2 Detention Alternative committee recommendations:

- \$33,750 to be awarded to M & S Psychotherapy for Evaluations.
- \$61,875 to be awarded to M & S Psychotherapy for Juvenile Sex Offender Services.

Project Cluster #4 Programs in Re-Entry

- \$100,000 to be awarded to Eva's Village for the Youth Respite Housing

CERTIFICATION OF NON-INVOLVEMENT IN PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES IN RUSSIA OR BELARUS

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:32-60.1, et seq.
