### Re-Bid Youth Services Plan Grant Administered by the Passaic County Department of Human Services

A review committee was convened for the purpose of evaluating requests for proposals submitted to the Purchasing Department in response to RFP-25-020 for the Passaic County Department of Human Services. The committee consisted of Tashai McFarlane, Jenny Vuksic, and Kayann Foster.

Management- 30 points, Technical- 50 points, and Cost- 20 points

Below are the Vendors that submitted proposals and a composite point total of the evaluation.

Proposals submitted by:

1. College Achieve Charter School (Colt Street Cares Program) 21 Market Street, Paterson, NJ 07505  
Committee feedback and analysis: This is a well written proposal. The application addresses all requirements in the specifications. Not a clear level of service, not clear how many sessions, and no total number to be saved.  
Total Composite Score: 90.25
2. D.S. Education Alliance - 139 Carroll Street, Paterson, NJ 07501  
Committee feedback and analysis: No transportation assistance options. Did not give the 5 program components in the scope of work. Salaries were very high for the number of hours.  
Total Composite Score: 62.5
3. Jumpstart Community Training & Services Inc. (Jumpstart Youth Services Program) 525 Broadway, Paterson, NJ 07514  
Committee feedback and analysis: This bidder did not complete the required forms.  
Total Composite Score: Disqualified
4. Oasis (Oasis Youth Empowerment and Wellness Program) 59 Mill Street, Paterson, NJ 07501  
Committee feedback and analysis: Did not list existing services and outcomes for them. Accessible location on Mill Street. They are already running a similar program to this one, partnerships with schools existing partnerships.  
Total Composite Score: 88.2
5. Calvary Baptist Church (Youth Empowerment and Wellness Program) 575 East 18<sup>th</sup> Street, Paterson, NJ 07514

Committee feedback and analysis: Serving all Passaic County, but transportation was not addressed. For their level of services, 10 youth and 70 workshops, the number of youths is very low. A lot of activity but a small number of youths are to be served.

Total Composite Score: 72

The committee recommends awarding the following contract:

- College Achieve Charter School for their Colt Street Cares Program in the amount of \$52,500.
